A TRIBUTE TO OUR MTI PIONEERS

The Ministry of Trade and Industry (MTI) hosted a Tribute Dinner today for our Pioneer Generation to thank them for their efforts towards nation-building. Hosted by Minister Lim Hng Kiang, the dinner was attended by 685 pioneers, including distinguished guests like MTI's former Ministers, Mr S Dhanabalan (1992-1993), Mr Yeo Cheow Tong (1994-1997) and Mr Lee Yock Suan (1997-1999).

- Pioneers across MTI's 9 statutory boards and Department of Statistics enjoyed the evening with special performances from staff. There was also a tribute video featuring 25 pioneers who shared stories of their work in early days of independence. - In his speech, Minister Lim Hng Kiang attributed our "economic miracle" to the hard work, perseverance and good policies by our pioneers. Drawing lessons from the past 50 years, he illustrated examples of how our pioneers had built strong institutions, undertook policy innovation and maintained convictions to think long-term to bring Singapore to where she is today.
- Ahead of the dinner, 65 pioneers had gone on a bus tour featuring two of Singapore's key developments, Jurong Island and Sentosa, on 5 November 2014. Other than witnessing the fruition of their hard work and contribution to the economic development of Singapore, these pioneers also appreciated the opportunity to interact with their colleagues from other agencies. A TRIBUTE TO MTI PIONEER GENERATION: BUS TOUR ON 5 NOV 2014

Spirits were high as 55 of our pioneers within the MTI family gathered on 5 November for a bus tour of Singapore's key developments – Jurong Island and Sentosa. Specially organised by JTC ahead of the Tribute Dinner, the excursion lent an excellent chance for our pioneers to interact with one another, as well as to witness the fruition of their hard work and contribution to the economic development of Singapore.

Jurong Island: The heart of Singapore's energy and chemicals industry

The day started bright and early at the JTC Summit with our pioneers visibly excited; and they had every reason to be so. Gazetted as a Protected Area since October 2001, Jurong Island has been off-limits to visitors, and this was an once-in-a-lifetime trip. The hour-long ride brought our pioneers through Jurong Island's key developments, including refineries, crackers and the Jurong Rock Caverns Gallery.
